

EDINGTON MUSIC FESTIVAL,

18-25 August, in The Priory Church, Edington.
The 64th Edington Music Festival will shortly be with us. After the commemorations of 2018, this year's theme, Laudate Dominum, is all about celebration, examining the relationship between worship and

many aspects of our daily lives - Public Service, Nature, Education, Science, Healing and of course Music.

The four daily services, sung by over 70 choristers from the UK's Cathedrals and Collegiate Choirs, accompanied by some of the best organists in the country, include some absolute gems of sacred choral music. Plainchant, of course, then Byrd, Weelkes, Palestrina; Leighton, Vaughan Williams, Britten and more. The Requiem Mass returns to its usual Friday evening slot, and this year it is the sublime Requiem by Gabriel Fauré. One of this year's highlights will be Benjamin Britten's 'Rejoice in the Lamb' and the festival commission is from David Bednall.

Regulars will be pleased that Jeremy Summerly is returning to take charge of the Consort; Matthew Martin continues his direction of the Nave Choir of men and boys, and Peter Stevens leads the Schola in their superb singing of plainchant at Matins and Compline especially. Former Festival Director Ashley Grote is one of the great organists who will be playing the organ before Evensong (Friday 24th).

The festival Musical Supper is on Wednesday 21st, after the regular live recording of Evensong by BBC Radio 3; and the Festival lunch is on Saturday 24th. Details and booking for these are available from Susie Hancock on 01225 754626.



A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

With so much that may give cause for concern on earth at present, I hope you will forgive me for looking at the heavens.

The music of the spheres is an ancient philosophical concept that regards the movements of celestial bodies—the Sun, Moon, and planets—as a form of *musica* (the Medieval Latin term for music). This "music" is not audible, of course, but is a harmonic, mathematical or religious concept.

Locally, as usual, when the sun was at its highest in this hemisphere, the solstice was celebrated at Stonehenge. The summer solstice sun rises close to the Heel Stone, and the sun's first rays shine into the centre of the monument. While it is possible that such an alignment could be coincidental, this astronomical orientation had been acknowledged since William Stukeley first identified its axis along the midsummer sunrise in 1720.

Stonehenge may be one of the most famous cosmological sites in the world but this year the subject of space has another echo. The first moon landing took place on 16 July 1969, exactly half a century ago. Never before had humans set foot on another celestial body and, despite enormous technological developments since then, the number of people who have done so still only totals 12.

Nevertheless, if cosmology teaches us anything, it is that things go round and round. The spin of the earth gives us day and night, the moon's orbit measures our months and the earth's orbit of the sun defines our year.

But we only notice the passing year because of the seasons and they only occur because of the tilt of the earth. Without that there would be no solstice, perhaps no Stonehenge and maybe no cosmology. So a little irregularity may be helpful in the long run, and let us hope that is true in human life too.

We were delighted to see such a high attendance at the Gaigers Brothers consultation event on the 20th May with over 50 completed feedback forms submitted. These will be evaluated by Gaigers in tandem with the Parish Council's response to the latest Lavington Lane site plan, as part of the continuing consultation process between the developer, community and parish council (this is a legal requirement). There will be further consultation opportunities for the community as the Lavington Lane site plan progresses.

The Annual Parish Meeting which also took place on the 20th of May, really re-enforced how fortunate we are to live in a parish that has so many organisations, working on behalf of the community, to provide support, friendship, worship and a myriad of activities for us to enjoy across all age groups. Thank you to everyone who helps out with these.

Our Playgrounds Committee has been working hard to update the play facilities in Robert's Playground as well as trying to solve the issue of litter at the BMX track. An extra bin will be procured to help with this, but in the meantime, we ask all users of this facility to take rubbish home and if there are any issues to contact the Parish Council clerk as soon as possible.

Due to the amount of rain we are getting, our footpaths team are taking a number of calls from walkers challenged with access due to overgrown paths. If a public right of way crosses or borders your land or garden and you have not done so already, please do trim them back to your boundary line.

Unnecessary or poor parking on Sandfield is increasing. Even though the Parish Council has no responsibility for this type of issue, it has been proactive in contacting the school and police for them to inform drivers to make better choices and highlight more suitable locations. If you are one of these people, please park thoughtfully and responsibly, being mindful that you could even be prosecuted.

We say a sad farewell to Councillor Mike Challinor who will be leaving our Parish Council after our July meeting. We thank him for his work on the Parish Council and wider across our community and wish him and Priscilla all the best for their new move.

This brings a new vacancy to our Parish Council, so we would love to hear from any prospective candidate. Do drop a line to our clerk, or contact me informally for a chat about the role. GREAT CHEVERELL BOOKMARK

Our latest set read was "The Language of Kindness- a Nurses Story" by Christie Watson which had won the Costa Prize. This is the story of a woman who became a nurse almost by chance. At school her career options had been either a marine biologist or to work with photography and



conservation. Having left school at sixteen with no direction she fell into work with Community Service Volunteers where she worked at a residential centre run by the charity, Scope. This led to a course in nursing which appears rather odd as, hating the sight of blood, she fainted when blood samples were taken from her!

The book charts her twenty years working through nursing: the training, the moves from one department to another from a Special Baby Unit to Accident and Emergency to Cancer Wards and to caring for the elderly. Her story reveals a lifetime of working with all kinds of people in funny and in tragic situations. Christie is at pains to emphasize that nursing is a life of hard work, stress and long hours but above all that, patients, however demanding, should be treated with respect and above all kindness.

We felt at times the book is repetitive and could have benefited from some pruning. We agreed that this is an interesting and valuable read for the picture it paints of the nursing profession, it's difficulties but also the rewards.

"The Camino is the most popular Christian Christian care for families pilgrimage route in the world" we learned from Anji Scofield, who has walked part of the route herself and came to share her

experiences with us at our meeting on 10th June. The distance along the Camino Frances, the main route, is 790kms or 490 miles and is traditionally walked over 33 days, commemorating the number of years that Jesus lived on earth. She gave us a brief history of the Camino Santiago De Compostela. The Apostle James is traditionally believed to be the first of the Apostles to be martyred for his faith. It is believed that his remains are buried in the Cathedral at Santiago de Compostela. Approximately a quarter of a million pilgrims walk the Camino every year from 138 different countries. Anji showed us items she had taken which were the various essential items that every pilgrim carries. These included: John Brierley's Camino Guide, showing 12 different routes and advice; and amongst other things, a stone. Pilgrims carry this and then leave it at the Crux de Ferro to represent leaving their burdens behind. Anji started her Camino journey in April 2017 at Logrono with friends and described the interesting sites, experiences, various weather conditions, accommodation etc she experienced along the way. She finished the first section of her walk in 2017 at Burgos. Last year she and a friend set off in October to do another section, setting off from St Jean Pied de Port in France. They enjoyed the constantly changing scenery and meeting interesting people along the way. Anji has completed 170 miles so far, so only has another 320 miles to go! We wish her well as she continues her pilgrimage in future days and look forward to hearing more interesting stories of her experiences.

Next meeting will be on Monday, July 8th at 2.15pm at the home of Janet Hodges by her kind invitation, when we will be preparing for the Church Fete.



Gardeners are by their very nature hardy individuals. On a cold, gloomy evening in June, therefore, there was an impressive turnout for a tour of three local gardens. The cold wind and the threat of rain was not enough to deter these doughty souls when there was

an opportunity to see what their fellow gardeners were doing in their gardens.

We started with a tour of the large grounds surrounding an old mill house. The landscape was undulating following the contours of the, now dry, old mill race and pond. The mill wheel was still in place but the mechanism within the house had been dismantled. One nice touch was that the old grindstones had been incorporated into the paved areas. The stream that supplied the mill pond was within the confines of the garden. Most of the garden was well trimmed lawns. There was a variety of mature trees alongside the old mill pond area. Close to the house and alongside the stream there were many flower borders. And there was a great many rose bushes. There was a large fruit cage with many fruit bushes, and an impressive three bay compost heap. The dwelling house was surrounded by the gardens and there was plenty of space to walk in all directions and plenty of features such as bridges and walls to add interest to each walk. The owner confessed to getting a little help with the mowing but otherwise he maintained this beautiful garden by himself.

By the time we reached the second garden the wind had dropped a bit and the threat of rain had diminished. This delightful garden was surrounded by mature mixed hedging. The front garden had narrow, colourful borders and some fruit trees and mountain ash. At the back close to the patio was a large pond with koi carp. There was a fountain and plenty of pond plants. A heron had taken some of the fish and so there was a network of strings over the pond to deter further fishing expeditions. To the delight of the owner a kingfisher visited the pond recently and could be observed from the house. The presence of bird feeders and other wildlife friendly features indicated that this was a garden where birds and animals were welcome.

At the final garden, although the owners were away that evening, they had left us a written summary of the changes they had made during their 3 years there. This included the removal of some leylandi and some dead and dying trees and the planting of 10 new trees. They had replaced some box hedging with new laurel hedges. They had built a second bridge over the stream. And they had updated the borders with a variety of their favourite plants. They described it as a work in progress as they are still brimming with ideas of things to do in the future. We had visited the garden many years ago and we could see how the improvements made the garden more manageable and more suitable for the lifestyle of the current owners.

We were all glad that we had braved the weather that evening. It was interesting to see the gardens and we felt inspired to borrow ideas for use in our own gardens.

Our next meeting, on Tuesday 9 July, will be a visit to a Potterne based business which supplies flowers to local florists. Here we will have a chance to tour the smallholding and also to create our own flower posy. There will be an earlier than usual start time of 6.30pm. EBENEZER BAPTIST CHURCH Leadership

As I write, the Conservative leadership elections are in full swing, with the various candidates having launched their campaigns to be the next Prime Minister. Needless to say, each of the contenders believes they are best placed to lead our great nation through Brexit and beyond. I am no political pundit, so I shall refrain from trying to predict the winner. All will be revealed later in July.

But this might be a good time to reflect on leadership. We all know that having a good boss can make a massive difference in the world of work. We want someone with a clear idea of where they want to go and are able to inspire their staff to work with them to achieve their goals. US President Harry S. Truman once said, 'Leadership is the ability to get men to do what they don't want to do, and like it.' I'm sure there's something in that. We are often reluctant to embrace change, but a decent leader will enable us see the benefit of new ways of doing things. It certainly helps if people believe the boss has their best interests at heart.

Becoming Prime Minister in the current circumstances will present a huge leadership challenge to the successful candidate. Yes, there's Brexit, but a host of other big issues have been kept on the back burner by the process of Britain exiting the EU. What about social care, the environment, further investment in education and defence, and so on? All got to be done, and more. It is sometimes suggested that politicians are motivated solely by self-interest and delusions of grandeur, but most get involved because they want to make a difference. Accusations of self-interest are nothing new, however. It was said of Liberal Prime Minister Henry Campbell Bannerman that he 'always thought more of his policy than he did of himself'. By way of contrast, when David Lloyd George became Prime Minister, 'he ensured the death of the Liberal Party by reversing the order of priorities.'

We'll have to see whether the next Conservative Prime Minister puts policy or him/herself first. Jesus offered a radically new style of leadership. His followers were vying amongst themselves to see who would be the greatest in the kingdom of God. Jesus told them that was entirely the wrong approach, 'You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.' (Matthew 20:25-28)

Jesus put his people before himself. He came to serve them. He gave his life to pay the price of their sin when he died upon the cross. He is the original model of self-giving, servant leadership. Jesus Christ is the world's true Lord with all authority in heaven and earth in his hands, yet he is gentle and lowly in heart. He calls upon us to follow him. He has taken the burden of our sins upon himself. He rose again that all who believe in him may have the hope of eternal life. Jesus will share his glory with his people when he returns. He said, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.' (John 8:12). Now that's a leader worth following.
